### Purpose of the Job:

To be the accountable officer responsible for responding to planning applications, Local Plans and other growth related policies, ensuring appropriate levels of infrastructure and developer contributions are provided to create well-designed, sustainable communities within North Kent.

### Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Ensure appropriate levels of infrastructure and mitigation are delivered in support of growth within North Kent communities.
- 2. Take a strategic overview and co-ordinate responses and representations for the County Council on planning applications, Local Plan consultations, Community Infrastructure Levy consultations, Development Briefs, Masterplans and other relevant consultations to ensure sufficient infrastructure is provided for in North Kent, including within Infrastructure Delivery Plans.
- 3. Take a lead role in establishing and co-ordinating strategic partnerships, both internal and external to Kent County Council (KCC), to secure further funding and joint working opportunities regarding growth and infrastructure matters in North Kent.
- 4. Oversee the Education and Community Service Infrastructure needs of North Kent, maintaining up to date records of infrastructure capacity, demand and availability.
- Co-ordinate responses to any challenge to KCC's infrastructure requests including, as necessary, gathering and preparing evidence and supporting their defence at planning appeals.
- 6. Review, comment and, on occasion, assist in the drafting of complex legal s106 agreements, Unilateral Undertakings and Heads of Terms, often requiring disciplined negotiation to protect the interests of the County Council.

- Identify innovative and creative solutions to development master planning that present opportunities for sustainable living and efficiencies in KCC service delivery.
- 8. Prepare and present regular management reports and briefings for Directors and Elected Members on the progress of infrastructure provision and seek views in relation to resources, service development and timescales, highlighting risks and making recommendations to ensure that infrastructure is delivered successfully.
- Contribute to, and prepare funding bids, business cases and specification briefs on major projects with a North Kent focus, linking in with other local authorities and Central Government where appropriate, developing contingency plans and representing the team at public events.
- 10. Contribute to and, on occasion, co-ordinate the delivery of policies relating to developer contributions and cohesive and well-designed community infrastructure to support KCC service delivery.
