Kent County Council Job Description: Flood Risk Project Officer

Purpose of the Job:

The post holder will work in the Flood and Water Management Team and support the delivery of Kent County Council's (KCC's) role as Lead Local Flood Authority. They will lead on the delivery of projects to deliver flood risk management projects to reduce the risk of flooding, in accordance with the Local Flood Risk Management Strategy.

They will oversee the development, funding and delivery of projects that manage the risks from local flood sources. They will be a point of contact for residents and communities about our plans to manage flood risk and the projects that we are undertaking. They will work with partners to deliver projects that provide multiple benefits for Kent and support our wider objectives to improve outcomes for residents and support the environment.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Acting as the project manager, oversee consultants that investigate local flood risks in the county for a range of flood risk management purposes, including
 - to investigate flood and map flood risks
 - to identify appropriate flood risk management options
 - to design schemes that manage these risks
- 2. Develop the scope of works for these projects, procure consultants in accordance with KCC's procurement protocols and manage the consultants to ensure projects are on time, on budget and deliver the necessary objectives.
- 3. Working with the Flood and Water Manager and the Partnerships and Programme Officer identify funding to support the delivery of flood risk management projects. Develop funding bids and business cases to secure funding.
- 4. Supervise the delivery of flood risk management schemes by contractors. Prepare the scope of works for the scheme and procure contractors to deliver it. Supervise the delivery of the scheme by the contractor.

- 5. Support the development of the programme of flood risk management projects, helping to identify and prioritise projects to deliver.
- 6. Liaise with local communities, residents and their representatives on the delivery of our flood risk management projects, providing feedback and updates to ensure they are kept informed of progress, which may require work outside of core office hours.
- 7. Work with partners, including risk management authorities, planning authorities and local communities, to develop opportunities for partnership projects, providing support as necessary to projects delivered by partners.
- 8. Support the Flood and Water Management Team to develop flood risk management policy and promote the work and activities of the team. Provide support to other tasks necessary to the functioning of the Flood and Water Management Team.
