Job Description: *Senior Practitioner Children's Occupational Therapist*

Directorate: Children, Young People and Education
Unit/Section: Children's Social Services
Grade: KR11
Responsible to: Principal Occupational Therapist

Purpose of the Job:

Provide a consultative/supervisory service to an area occupational therapy team, through the provision of professional expertise, skills and advice to enable an effective, safe and high-quality children's occupational therapy service that meets agreed existing and new policies, procedures and practices.

Manage a caseload of complex major equipment and adaptation cases which requires a high level of specialist expertise.

The post holder should be working in line with the Kent County Council Social Care Capabilities Framework.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Manage a complex caseload of disabled children, providing specialist assessment and clinical reasoning skills to identify appropriate solutions for housing adaptations and equipment issues, and taking responsibility for updating these skills to ensure continuous professional development in OT practice.
- Provide a high-quality resource of professional occupational therapy expertise and knowledge to include casework supervision, case conference, audit and reviews, regular meetings etc, and to the various agencies carrying out adaptation and equipment provision to ensure the delivery of a high standard of service.
- Monitor and evaluate the performance of a group of Occupational Therapists /Assistants in accordance with agreed procedures and the criteria laid down in the Social care Competency Assessment Framework Career Grade Scheme to maintain high practice standards and enable the continued development of professional skills and expertise that meet service needs.
- The Senior Practitioner Children's OT is responsible for the day to day operational management of the locality North West Kent, South West Kent or North East or South East locality areas.
- The Senior Practitioner Children's OT is responsible for maintaining screening target times and case allocation times within a locality.

- The Senior Practitioner Children's OT will be responsible for supervision and professional development of children's OT staff within the locality.
- The Senior Practitioner Children's OT will ensure they are up to date with Kent County Council Management policies and directives and ensure they regularly update their management skills and performance in line with Kent Manager requirements.
- Contribute to the development and maintenance of effective strategies, procedures and practices to ensure compliance with performance monitoring requirements.
- Act if required as a Practice Educator to support student placements.
- Liaise regularly with peer colleagues throughout the Directorate to ensure OT staff deliver existing and new practices consistently and to a high standard across the Directorate.
- Contribute to the development of existing and new initiatives through the attendance on working groups, multi agency forums, training courses etc and acting as lead for identified pieces of Directorate initiatives, e.g., Liberi, Disabled Children's service policy and procedures, and research work to develop effective working practices that meet service requirements.
- Maintain awareness of change in legislation and related policies and practices and ensure all OT and multi agency partners and staff are also informed of these changes to enable consistent and timely implementation.
- Ensure that information systems and records are effectively maintained to provide reliable, up to date and accurate information within their locality, including the monitoring of expenditure as required by the OT Team Leader and the collation of activity level data. This will include reference to the Directorate (County Council) Policy, and financial procedures for auditing purposes.
