Purpose of the Job:

To contribute to safer active travel in Kent by facilitating the Youth Travel Ambassador Programme to promote safer and responsible road user behaviour. The post holder will support the Safer Road User Officer to promote and deliver the Youth Travel Ambassador programme, engaging with Kent secondary schools and coordinate the delivery of the virtual programme to young people.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Promote and recruit schools to participate in the YTA Programme.
- 2. Arrange and facilitate the virtual delivery of Youth Travel Ambassador (YTA) Programme in the target number of Kent secondary schools.
- 3. Schedule timed interventions with schools, within agreed delivery deadlines.
- 4. Support staff in schools to deliver the virtual YTA education sessions, organising and facilitate learning events when necessary to support the YTA Programme.
- 5. Support the project lead by evaluating the inputs and outcomes of the YTA programme and monitoring associated budget use.
- 6. Develop and maintain good working relationships with schools, youth groups, appropriate KCC teams and other key stakeholders.
- 7. Support the Road Safety Team by promoting to participating YTA schools the interventions delivered within the Vision Zero and Active Travel strategies.
- 8. Support the collation of data in terms of engagement, advertising, funding, evaluative records, contributing to quarterly and end of year reports.
