Purpose of the Job:

As a Highways Engineer, you will be placed within the Active Travel Team and will support the Team Leader and Project Managers in progressing various civil engineering tasks and projects.

The team focus is to design and delivery of Active Travel schemes which include safer provision for walking, cycling and wheeling across the county. You will also be involved with the development of Highway safety improvements schemes and Section 106 funded schemes.

With assistance, the post holder will provide technical advice, highway design, assist with general administrative tasks when required. The holder will have an understanding of Highway Engineering and be an excellent communicator and able to work with a wide range of stakeholders.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Undertake civil engineering roles for the respective Team Leader and Project Managers, this may include assisting with carrying out the design, procurement and site supervision of highway improvement schemes.
- Assist with carrying out site visits including setting out and construction audits to ensure schemes are being constructed in accordance with agreed and approved designs.
- 3. Assist in the preparation of risk assessments and method statements. Ensure compliance with Health and Safety legislation, e.g. CDM 2015.
- 4. Assist with budget planning and reporting in areas of responsibility within the team.
- 5. Assist in the promotion of schemes and the preparation of materials for public consultations.
- 6. Assist in the preparation of briefs to consultants and other service providers to help in the fulfilment of fulfilling the duties allocated, and work with commissioned suppliers and third parties to ensure the efficient delivery of all commissioned works.
- 7. Ensure all project documentation and correspondence is logged and filed accurately.

- 8. Ensure communications, enquiries and complaints are managed sympathetically, accurately and in a timely manner in line with KCC procedures.
- 9. You will be required to provide assistance to other teams within the GET directorate, or any other part of KCC, from time to time as and when your skills and knowledge are required for particular projects and initiatives.
