### Purpose of the Job:

To oversee the referral and assessment process of referrals to Channel, and supervise Channel case management, to deliver effective support packages to people at risk of radicalisation across Kent and Medway.

### Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. To manage and supervise the case work of the two Channel Coordinators, ensuring case management is completed in accordance with Home Office Office of Security and Counter Terrorism (OSCT) national guidance.
- 2. To oversee the referrals and assessment process for Channel and the delivery of support packages for young people and adults across Kent and Medway who are vulnerable to become radicalised
- 3. To be the designated role responsible for Section 36, Counter Terrorism and Security Act 2015 decisions on the Home Office Case Management Information System (CMIS).
- 4. Review and develop operational policies and procedures to ensure the effective working practice of Channel delivery across Kent County Council and Medway Unitary Authority.
- 5. Support the Kent and Medway Prevent team to ensure that the Channel Duty Guidance as published by the Office for Security and Counter Terrorism is fully implemented, and compliance of Kent and Medway Channel processes.
- 6. Provide regular Channel performance updates to the relevant governance boards, including the Kent and Medway Prevent Duty Delivery Board.
- 7. To be the Channel operational link with the Counter Terrorism Police South East Counter Terrorism Supervisor and Counter Terrorism Police Case Officers.
- 8. To brief the Kent and Medway Channel co chairs prior to every Channel Panel.
- 9. To work in partnership with Home Office, Office of Security and Counter Terrorism
