Purpose of the Job:

To deliver the aims of the Medway Valley Countryside Partnership (MVCP) by delivering habitat management tasks and community-based projects across the MVCP area.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Deliver community, habitat management, environmental and recreational tasks as detailed in the MVCP business and action plans.
- Specifically;
 - Deliver the pre-planned habitat management tasks at various sites with volunteers.
 - Support the delivery of other land management tasks and activities as required.
- Carry out site visits in order to plan and prepare habitat management activities.
- Deliver various habitat management activities at various sites whilst supporting and supervising volunteers.
- Ensure Health & Safety policy is implemented at all times.
- Assist with the delivery of other MVCP projects including Public Events, Guided Walks and Ecological surveying
